SERVICES OFFERED

- **Behaviour consultations**
A three hour + session, carried out at the client's home, covering all training and behavioural problems, followed up with a written program for the client to follow, and weekly phone updates.
- **One-to-one training sessions**
A two hour session, carried out at a location convenient to the client assisting with training problems such as play biting, pulling on the lead, poor recall, destruction, stealing and jumping up on people.
- **Pet dog training classes**
Held on Monday and Thursday evenings at 7.30pm. The venue is All Saints Church Hall, New Cross Road, SE14 (between Monson Road and Casella Road). We run a nine week course for clients who prefer to train in a group, covering specific training exercises such as walking to heel, recall, stay when told, preventing jumping up and teaching dogs to leave an object when told.
- **Boarding**
Offered by a colleague in her own home in SW London, where dogs are walked daily, have access to a 300 foot garden and an adjoining private woodland.
- **Dog walking**
Offered by a colleague, primarily covering SW London and surrounding areas. Dogs are walked in small groups.

By 1984 he was competing successfully at obedience shows and going to dog training classes four-five nights a week, and by 1985 he was running his own dog training club. He worked as an Animal Welfare Officer for Lewisham Council from 1990-2006, where he became the senior officer and acquired even more experience dealing with a variety of animals and their owners. However, it's his uncanny understanding of dogs that makes him exceptional in his field.

Robert has been running his own dog training classes since 1985, training thousands of dogs and their owners. He has also coached many others in instructing and taking classes, some of whom went on to run their own successful classes. He regularly gives talks at a variety of different functions, from private parties, to other dog training establishments, to colleges and universities.

He has made numerous appearances on radio and television programmes including the hugely popular BBC series **Dog Borstal**.

His other credits include:

- A Board Member and the Applications Officer for the UK Registry of Canine Behaviourists.
- A Board Member and an Assessor for the Kennel Club Accreditation Scheme for Instructors.
- An Expert Witness in court cases involving dogs.
